AUTHOR'S NOTE

"APHASIA and related disorders" publishes articles on the diagnosis and treatment of aphasia and related problems in German, French and Italian. The original articles are on general topics, group- and individual-study cases as well as methodological questions on diagnosis and therapy. Relevant publications from the aforementioned areas are discussed in abridged versions.

The documents must be forwarded to the editorial office¹ electronically. However, a paper copy is preferable, particularly with articles featuring graphs.

Original articles: max. length of 10 pages (with double spaces 20 pages, max. 40,000 characters incl. spaces) including summaries in German, French and English (max. 200 words).

Articles for the forum, Book reviews: max. length of 5 pages (with double spaces 8 pages, max. 20,000 characters).

Each article must include a contact address, incl. e-mail, at the end.
